Techniques of integration; The Mean Value Theorem and its consequences; series, Taylor series with applications; parametric and polar curves with applications; first order linear and separable differential equations with applications.

What is expected of the student: Students are expected to attend all lectures and complete all assignments and examinations. Solutions of collected homework problems must be written neatly, and handed in by the deadline.

Calculator policy: use of calculators will **not** be permitted for midterm tests and final examinations.
